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The Green Scene

Inspired by the Australian-founded initiative and co-hosted by Calgary Zoo and the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium, Plastic Free July is a 31-day international challenge to reduce and refuse single-use plastics. In 2018, a coalition of North American zoos and aquariums (including the San Antonio Zoo) partnered with Northwest Earth Institute to create an online EcoChallenge platform that allowed participants to choose action pledges, monitor their progress, and track their collective impact throughout the month. Categories for the challenge were food, personal care, community, lifestyle, and create your own, and featured actions like refusing straws at restaurants, carrying reusable bags and beverage containers, and purchasing products without plastic packaging.

Last year there were 5,242 participants on 78 teams from the zoo and aquarium community. Overall, they saved 35,383 plastic straws; 37,174 pieces of plastic cutlery; 28,166 plastic bottles; 17,776 plastic containers; and 14,776 disposable cups worth of waste not sent to the landfill! Our zoo's team, the San Antonio Zoo Crew, had 147 members and finished the challenge in 17th place with 25,279 points. Our impact included:

- 1,033 pieces of plastic cutlery; 808 plastic bottles; 294 plastic containers; 701 plastic straws; and 306 disposable cups not sent to the landfill
- 88 hours of volunteerism
- 53 petitions signed
- 1,407 pieces of litter picked up
- 15 community events
- 202 zero-waste meals consumed

Due to the success of 2018's challenge, this year's Plastic Free July was open to participants outside the zoo and aquarium industry as well. The online platform is easy to use and encourages participants to share their experiences on the feed and across social media. The San Antonio Zoo Crew participated again this year. The challenge is a fun way to learn about sustainability while fostering teamwork and encouraging connections with other participants across the industry. Let's keep the spirit of Plastic Free July going all year long and let's kick the plastic habit!
