

2021 Virtual Conference Recap

As the pandemic has dragged on it has been more important than ever to maintain connections with our colleagues for advice and support. Though travel remained off the table again, the goal of the virtual conference series, Catalyst for Good Change, was to keep our members in touch and focus on the positive lessons from the past two years. Presentation topics included resiliency, sustainability, operational adaptations for COVID-19, and discussions of diversity, equity, access, and inclusivity. Sessions also provided opportunities for behind-the-scenes access at different facilities during the member of the month and feature facility segments. Feedback from the membership was encouraging, and having recordings available on the website helped reach a wider audience.

The online silent auction, organized by Florence Tang and Nikki Myers, raised \$2,491.96 for the Clark Waldram Fund – a remarkable total that rivals proceeds from in-person auctions at previous conferences! These funds will support a modular housing project at the Punta San Juan preserve in Peru to provide wildlife researchers with a safe base camp and field station. Thank you to all the auction sponsors, donors, and participants, and especially to Flo and Nikki.

The complimentary membership scheme was a great success, resulting in the addition of over 100 new members since the 2020 virtual conference. For 2022, memberships are returning to their normal rates of \$31 for individuals and \$124 for commercial or organization levels, valid per calendar year January 1st through December 31st.


